Learning Opportunities 2: Responding

Year Level: Year 3

Lesson Focus:

Students will research in more depth a land artist; Andy Goldsworthy, Walter Mason or John Wolseley while identifying the different mediums used.

Students will explain their interpretation of the purpose/function of the artwork

Students will construct a nutshell statement outlining the message they believe the artist is trying to convey.

- discussing the place and function of visual arts works in communities and how they represent life, environments, and the past and present
- describing how visual arts works reflect values of care, respect and responsibility towards others and the environment

Activities:

- Students merge into small groups of 3 or 4 and choose 1 of the land artists; Goldsworthy, Mason or Davis.
- Students research using their own means; ICT, books, articles, artworks based on their artist.
- Students share with class their findings and opinions/interpretations of the piece of art.

Assessment:

Students will create a peer and self-assessment rubric outlining characteristics that associate with the learning focus; for example: has the student demonstrated background information about the artists, has the student outlined their opinion and justified why they think this.

Observation of the process of working in small group – collaboration.
